●Emergency

Call 119 when you need an ambulance due to a sudden illness or serious injury.

- You can call from landlines, payphones, mobile phones, or PHS phones. Calls are free of charge.
- Ambulance services are free of charge. However, you may be responsible for subsequent treatment costs at the medical facility to which you are transported.

●Fire

In the event of a fire, please remain calm and do the following:

1. **Notify quickly** → **Call 119** and report the fire as soon as possible. Warn as many neighbors as you safely can.
2. **Extinguish quickly** → **Do not panic!** Attempt to extinguish the fire if it is in the early stages and looks controllable.
3. **Evacuate quickly** → If the fire is spreading quickly or reaches the ceiling, evacuate immediately.

When you dial 119 on the phone, you will be connected to the fire department. The staff member will ask you the following questions, so please answer calmly:

1. Is this a fire? Is this an ambulance call?
2. Where is the location? Is there anything nearby that can serve as a landmark?
3. Please provide your name and phone number.

The way you ask may differ depending on the type of emergency (fire, medical, rescue).

If you don't know the location (address), ask a passerby or someone nearby who knows the address, or have them take the call for you. Alternatively, describe a large building, convenience store, gas station, or other prominent landmark you can see nearby.

If you don't understand and/or speak Japanese, please stay calm and tell us which country you're from (or your native language). We will connect you to an interpreter. We can provide interpretation in 32 languages.

Please do not hang up until you are connected to an interpreter.

Disaster Prevention

●Plan Ahead for Heavy Rain, Typhoons, and Landslides

1. Stay up to date with current weather conditions.
2. Ensure you keep adequate household supplies on hand, in case you must shelter in place.
3. Reinforce and maintain your home's windows, storm doors, antennas, fences, signs, etc.
4. Clean the ditches and waterways surrounding your home to prevent them from overflowing.
5. Be cautious of potential mudslides and landslides near cliffs, steep slopes, mountains, and rivers.

●Flood and Landslide Hazard Map

The city has prepared a "Flood and Landslide Hazard Map" that identifies areas at risk of floods and landslides. Versions are available in Japanese, Easy Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, and Vietnamese.



●Inland Flood Hazard Map

This map shows areas where flooding damage is expected to occur, assuming the maximum rainfall intensity (147 mm/hour) occurs. Versions are available in Japanese, Easy Japanese, English, Chinese, Korean, and Vietnamese.

●Response During an Earthquake

1. Stay calm and attend to your own safety first.
2. Once the shaking stops, extinguish any small fires, if you can.
3. Do not rush out in a panic (this will help keep emergency exits accessible).
4. Wear shoes or thick slippers to avoid injury from broken glass.
5. Evacuate on foot. Take as few personal belongings as possible.
6. If possible, turn off your home's electricity at the main breaker box as you evacuate.
7. Avoid narrow alleys, fences, cliffs, and riverbanks as you carefully leave the affected area.
8. Be careful of possible landslides and mudslides.
9. Stay informed using reliable sources.
10. Work together to provide emergency relief when you are able.

☆**Foreign nationals are permitted to engage in employment activities within the scope of their status of residence.**

There are residence statuses that permit employment within the scope specified by a specific status, residence statuses with no restrictions on employment activities, and residence statuses that generally do not permit employment.

For example, “Student” and “Family Stay” are residence statuses that generally do not permit employment. However, if permission for “Activities Outside the Scope of the Designated Status” is obtained from the Regional Immigration Bureau, part-time work up to 28 hours per week is permitted.

☆**If certain requirements are met, you must pay taxes.**

Individuals who have earned income while working within Japan are generally required to pay income tax.

☆**All residents of Japan, regardless of nationality, are enrolled in the public health insurance system.**

This system ensures equal access to high-quality, advanced medical care by sharing the burden across society, thereby reducing out-of-pocket medical expenses.

Individuals under the age of 75 who are registered residents but not covered by workplace health insurance must sign up for and maintain enrollment in Japan's National Health Insurance system.

★How to Dispose of Garbage

We have implemented a sticker system for household waste.

When you register as a resident, we provide stickers that are applied to bags when disposing of household garbage. The amount of stickers provided is based on the number of people in your household.

Please purchase the city-recommended garbage bags at supermarkets or similar stores, place your trash inside them, affix the seal, and dispose of them at the garbage collection point near your home.

The following types of waste require stickers.

Combustible waste (e.g. kitchen garbage, such as food scraps, paper waste, etc.)

〈Twice-weekly collection〉

- Before placing garbage bags out for collection, put one sticker on a recommended see-through 30-liter garbage bag. Put two stickers on a recommended see-through 45-liter garbage bag.

Bulky waste (e.g. furniture such as tables and chairs, bicycles, futons, etc.)

〈Monthly collection〉

- Please place a bulky waste sticker directly on each item you are putting out for collection.

Be mindful of the following:

- Generally, garbage should be placed out on the morning of a collection day.
- If you dispose of garbage that does not conform to the specified types, or place it outside the designated collection areas, it will not be collected.
- Do not dispose of garbage anywhere other than designated areas. Disposing of garbage outside designated areas may result in criminal penalties.

Notification Regarding Address

●Individuals required to report their address

Foreign residents who must report their address to the city office for it to be added to the Residence Registration System include:

- Persons holding a residence card (※3) (mid- to long-term residents).
- Special permanent residents.
- Persons granted temporary asylum or provisional stay.
- Individuals with temporary status due to birth or loss of Japanese nationality.

●Notification Regarding Resident Records

You are required to notify us when you first move into Tondabayashi City, when you move out of Tondabayashi City, or when you move within Tondabayashi City.

If a third party (i.e. person other than a family member living in the same household) wishes to make a notification regarding a resident's official record, a letter of authorization is required.

(※1) Original documents within their validity period are required, such as residence cards, driver's licenses, or passports.

(※2) If someone other than the cardholder wishes to perform procedures related to the My Number Card (including electronic certificates), a letter of authorization from the cardholder may be required. For details, please contact the Citizen Services Section.

(※3) For residence cards, this includes specific residence cards that combine the residence card and My Number card. For special permanent resident certificates, this includes specific special permanent resident certificates that combine the special permanent resident certificate and My Number card.

Seal Registration and Certification

●About Seal Registration

When renting or buying a house, or purchasing a car, you will need a registered seal (called a “Jitsu-in” or “Hanko”) registered at the city office.

Seal registration is available for city residents 15 years of age or older. When applying, please provide your own seal for registration.

If an agent must apply on your behalf, a letter of authorization from the applicant is required.

Once the application is submitted, we will mail a verification form for confirmation. Please bring the completed response form, the seal to be registered, and identification documents (such as a health insurance eligibility certificate or driver's license) to the Citizen Services Section. Upon submission of the response form, we will issue you a seal registration certificate.

●Request for Seal Registration Certificate

A fee is charged when a proof of seal certificate is issued. Please attach your seal registration card when applying. A representative possessing your seal registration card is **not** required to provide a letter granting power of attorney. If your seal has not yet been registered, or if your seal registration card has been lost, please complete the seal registration procedure. Please note that requests cannot be made by mail.

If you have a My Number Card, you can obtain certificates yourself by using the multi-function copiers installed at convenience stores and other locations. (Available hours: 6:30 AM to 11:00 PM)

●My Number (Individual Number)

All registered residents in Japan are given a unique 12-digit personal identification number called “My Number”.

●My Number Card

My Number Card is an IC-embedded identification card that includes your photo and your personal My Number printed on the back.

When presenting your My Number at government agency counters or at your workplace, both number verification and identity confirmation can be completed with a single document. It can be widely used as an official form of identification, as well as for online applications for various administrative procedures and for obtaining copies of your residence certificate or seal registration certificate at convenience stores.

●How to apply

When your card is ready, we will send you a notice of issuance. Please bring your identification documents and other items listed on the notice to the City Hall My Number Card Issuance Counter or the Kongo Liaison Office.

Taxes

●Resident tax

Individual citizens tax is levied on residents who are living in the city as of January 1st and received income in the previous year, or individuals who do not live in the city, but own an office, business, or another residence that is located in the city (equal rate only).

You must report your previous year income to the Tax Administration Division between **February 16 – March 15** (excludes Saturday, Sunday, and national holidays). If you have already submitted a final income tax return, or if your employer or business has submitted your salary earnings report to the city office and there have since been no subsequent changes to your income for the year, then you do not need to submit a tax return.

●Fixed Asset Tax and City Planning Tax

Fixed asset tax is collected if you own fixed assets or properties (i.e. land, houses, or other depreciable assets and property) in the city as of **January 1**. Additional City Planning tax is levied on those who own land and residences in urban development areas.

The tax is not imposed on land and houses owned by a person if the total taxable amount is less than 300,000 yen for land, less than 200,000 yen for houses, and less than 1,500,000 yen for depreciable assets.

●Light Vehicle Tax (Classification-Based Tax)

This tax applies if you own or use a motorized bicycle, light “kei” motor vehicle, small, specialized motor vehicle, or small two-wheel motor vehicle, as of **April 1** (the date of tax imposition). If you are the owner of the vehicle on April 1, you are liable for the tax owed for the current fiscal year, even if you transfer the vehicle to another person or scrap the vehicle on, or after April 2.

If you move out of the city, sell or transfer ownership of the vehicle to another party, cease using the vehicle due to its condition, or if it is scrapped or stolen, please report the vehicle’s location status promptly.

National Health Insurance

●National Health Insurance Enrollment Procedures

All Tondabayashi City residents under the age of 75 must sign up for and maintain enrollment in Japan's National Health Insurance system. This requirement excludes individuals and their dependents who are covered by health insurance at their place of employment, and individuals who are receiving public assistance.

If enrollment procedures are delayed, you will be required to pay premiums retroactively for up to two years, starting from the date you became eligible for National Health Insurance (e.g. the day after leaving a company, the day you ceased being a dependent, the date of moving in, the date you stopped receiving public assistance, or the date of birth). Please submit your notification to the Insurance and Pension Division or the Kongo Liaison Office.

※To apply for National Health Insurance, you will be required to submit one or more documents that confirms your identity, such as your residence card or driver's license, or documents that verify your government-designated personal identification number, such as your My Number card. For details, please contact the National Health Insurance & National Pension Division.

●Insurance Premium

Insurance premiums are assessed based on the household's income and the number of family members.

National Health Insurance enrollees from the age of 40 to 65 are required to pay premiums for medical care and support, as well as premiums for long-term care. National Health Insurance enrollees 65 years of age old or older who are enrolled in the National Health Insurance are required to pay premiums for long-term care insurance separately from their National Health Insurance premiums.

●Payment of insurance premiums

Insurance premiums should be paid by the end of every month, from June to March of the following year, with the following exceptions:

- If the last day of the month falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or national holiday, the payment is due on the next business day. December's premium payment is due on January 4 of the following year.
 - Please pay by the deadline at City Hall, the Kongo Liaison Office, at designated financial institutions and convenience stores.
- In the event of non-payment of insurance premiums

Please pay on time. If you do not pay on time and you do not have a special reason, such as experiencing a disaster, the following actions may be taken:

If you are delinquent on your insurance premiums for one year, you may be required to pay the full amount upfront at the medical facility's counter. This will be covered later through the "Special Medical Expense" program upon application. Alternatively, your benefits may be suspended entirely.

It is important that you do not forget to pay your insurance premiums. If you continue to be late with your insurance premium payments, without any reasonable event such as a disaster to explain the late payments, or if you fail to pay the premiums even after being sent a collection notice, property and assets (such as your bank and credit accounts) may be subject to seizure.

National Pension

● Japanese law requires that all Japan residents from the age of 20 to 60 enroll in the National Pension Plan. Pension plan enrollees are categorized as follows :

Category 1 Insured Person	Farmers, self-employed individuals, students, unemployed persons, etc., aged 20 or older but under 60.
Category 2 Insured Person	Company employees, civil servants, etc.
Category 3 Insured Person	Spouses aged 20 or older but under 60 who are dependents of Category 2 insured persons (annual income under ¥1.3 million)

● Pension Premiums

If you are in Category 1, you will be sent a payment slip to include with your pension premiums. You can pay your premiums in advance using bank account transfers. Premium discounts are offered if you pay in advance. For details, please contact your local pension office.

Note that Category 2 and Category 3 insured persons contribute collectively to the National Pension from their respective pension systems, so they do not need to pay premiums individually.

● Pension Lump-Sum withdrawal payment

Foreign resident pension plan enrollees who have made premium payments for at least 6 months while staying in Japan but will not be eligible to collect a basic old-age pension, may request a lump-sum withdrawal payment within two years after leaving Japan and no longer having a residence in Japan.

Long-term Care Insurance

●Long-Term Care Insurance Enrollees

The long-term care insurance system is a mutual support system that gives society the peace of mind that individuals will have access to long-term care services.

Generally, all individuals aged 40 and over are enrolled, and are categorized as Category 1 or Category 2 insured persons, based on age.

Category 1 Insured Person	People aged 65 and over.
Category 2 Insured Person	Individuals aged 40 to 64 who are enrolled in health insurance

●How to Pay Insurance Premiums

- Premiums for Category 1 insured persons are generally deducted from their pensions.
- Category 2 insured persons pay their premiums together with the premiums for their enrolled health insurance.

●Individuals eligible to use long-term care insurance services

Category 1 Insured Person	Individuals who have applied to the city for long-term care insurance services and have been certified as in need of nursing care or support based on their physical and/or mental condition, or those who have been determined to be eligible based on a basic checklist.
Category 2 Insured Person	Individuals who require long-term care due to age-related illnesses (16 specific diseases) and have applied to the city and been certified as in need of nursing care and support.

· Application

To make use of long-term care services, you should apply with the city and have your need certified (support levels 1 or 2, long-term care levels 1 – 5) or determined based on a basic checklist .

Apply with the Senior Citizens Welfare & Kaigo-Hoken (Long-Term Care Insurance) Division, the Regional Comprehensive Support Center (located in the Keauparu Kagari no Sato Community Center), the Kongo Liaison Office, **the Human Rights Culture Center**, or the Home Care Support Center. Please bring your long-term care insurance card (or your health insurance card if you belong to Category 2) to apply.

If needed, an in-home care support provider or a nursing care insurance administrator can apply on your behalf.

●Children's Healthcare

Children's Medical Certificates are issued to children enrolled in health insurance from birth until the first March 31 following their 18th birthday (or March 31 of their 17th year for those born on April 1). These certificates provide partial subsidies for medical expenses.

How to Sort and Dispose of Garbage



●Household garbage (collected twice a week)

Combustible household waste is collected twice a week. To promote waste reduction, Tondabayashi City provides stickers that are applied to bags when disposing of household garbage. Please cooperate. Put one sticker on a recommended see-through 30-liter garbage bag. Put two stickers on a recommended see-through 45-liter garbage bag before putting out your trash.

●Recyclable waste

Empty cans, empty glass bottles	You can mix empty cans and empty glass bottles in the same bag. Please dispose in a clear or see-through bag, or in a designated disposal bin.	Twice a month
PET bottles (clear plastic beverage bottles)	Please separate by type and put out in a clear or see-through bag.	
Plastic containers and packaging		
Paper beverage containers (milk cartons, etc.)	Please put out in a clear or see-through bag.	Once a month

- Please do not put earthenware or glass cups in bags.
- Spray cans and cassette cylinders will be collected with empty cans and empty bottles. However, if gas remains, it may lead to a serious accident such as a fire or explosion. Ensure that the gas is fully released from the container prior to disposal. In a well-ventilated place, make a hole in the can to remove the gas before disposal.

●Oversized garbage (Collected once a month)

Please put an 'oversized garbage' sticker on your bulky garbage when disposing of it.

Gas cylinders, fire extinguishers, tires, motorcycles, batteries, and similar items cannot be collected. Please have the retailer take them back or arrange for disposal by a specialized company. Additionally, industrial waste, hazardous materials, items larger than 150 cm square, and small rechargeable batteries (such as lithium-ion batteries) cannot be collected.

- Small rechargeable batteries (such as lithium-ion batteries) may catch fire during garbage collection. Please bring them to the reception desk at public facilities.

● Home appliances

Due to the enactment of the Home Appliance Recycling Law, air conditioners, televisions, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines and clothes dryers cannot be disposed of as bulky waste .

If you need to dispose of an appliance, please contact the dealer where you purchased the item or the store where you are considering purchasing a replacement. Retailers are obliged to take back your old appliances when they sell you a new one. However, you may need to pay a recycling fee and/or collection and transportation fees at the retailer.

Furthermore, Tondabayashi City has concluded a cooperation agreement with **Renet Japan Recycle Co., Ltd.**, enabling home collection services for these types of home appliances.

● Personal computer

Computers cannot be disposed of as bulky waste. When disposing of a computer, please use Rinnet Japan Recycle Co., Ltd., which has a cooperation agreement with Tondabayashi City. **Renet Japan Recycle Co., Ltd.** will collect unwanted household computers and used small appliances (over 400 types) via courier service.

Marriage and Divorce

●Marriage

- Requirements for marriage between a foreign national and a Japanese national

The city or ward office should be notified. Japanese nationals must meet all the requirements for marriage specified by Japanese law. Foreign nationals must meet all the requirements for marriage specified by the laws in their home country.

Documents required for filing:

1. **Passport** (proof of nationality)
2. A **Certificate of No Impediment to Marriage** or equivalent document issued by the applicant's home country's embassy or consulate (if not prepared in Japanese, it must be accompanied by a certified translation bearing the translator's name, address, and seal).
3. **Marriage Registration Form** (available at the counter. Two witnesses aged 18 or older must sign the form. The form must be completed and submitted in Japanese.)

A foreign national who marries in Japan also needs to report the marriage to their home country. The procedures to follow vary from country to country, so please check with the embassy or consulate of your country.

- Change of Status of Residence

If you marry a Japanese national and wish to change your status of residence to that of a Japanese spouse, or if you marry another foreign national and wish to change your

status of residence to that of a spouse, please contact the Foreign Residents Information Center.

- Change of Information on Residence Card

If your name changes due to marriage, you are required to report the change to the Immigration Office. If there is a change in your place of residence, contact your local ward office.

- Other Changes

Taxes, pensions, health insurance, and benefit details may change at your workplace after you get married. Please consult with your employer for more information.

Please note that you may need certificates issued by the city office when visiting the Immigration Services Agency, embassies, or consulates.

● Divorce

- When getting divorced

If one of the marriage partners is a Japanese national living in Japan, and both spouses agree to divorce, they can get a divorce under Japanese law. However, if the divorce is finalized in Japan, but the divorce process is not followed in the foreign national's home country, the marriage may still be considered valid in their country. Please also follow the proper legal procedures to get a divorce in your home country.

When both spouses are foreign nationals, the requirements and procedures for divorce vary by country. Please contact the respective embassy or consulate in Japan.

- Residence Status After Divorce

If you are living in Japan as a spouse of a Japanese national, or as a spouse of a foreign national with a residence status such as "Spouse or Child of Permanent Resident" or "Family Stay", you must notify the Immigration Office within 14 days of the divorce.

Individuals residing in Japan under statuses such as "Family Stay," or those residing under the status of "Spouse or Child of Japanese National" or "Spouse or Child of Permanent Resident," may be subject to revocation of their residence status if they do not engage in activities as a spouse for six months or longer. If you do not change your residence status, you may not be able to continue staying in Japan. Please contact various consultation services or the Foreign Residents Information Center for assistance.

- Change of Registered Information

If you change your name due to divorce, you must file a change notification with the Immigration Services Agency.

Additionally, if you change your place of residence, you must notify your local municipal office.

●Water bill

We will visit you every two months and read your water meter. To facilitate meter reading, please do not place any objects on top of the meter.

Water charges, including sewer usage fees, will be billed every two months.

- Depending on the neighborhood association or residents' association, the activities, management methods, and membership fees may vary.
